14. As per the ToR of the Project the Non-Key Personnel also needs to have experience in 220kV or above.

As we are all aware that there are a limited number of 220kV Transmission Lines that have been completed in Nepal consisting of 220kV or above. So, a very small number of Experts are available in Nepal.

Hence, we would like to request you to consider/accept the personnels with 132kV or above for the Non-Key Staffs.

The purpose of the Evidence of Financing is to verify that the consultant is financially sound enough to carry out the scope of work.

The suggestions stated are not clear.

There is no restriction in the RFP to propose only local experts from Nepal. The requirement of experience in 220kV transmission lines will not be modified.

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Relevant Extract from RFP:

The Transmission Lines Activity includes the "Benefit Integration through Knowledge-Sharing and Social Acceptance" (or MCA Partnership program) sub-Activity. This sub-Activity is proposed as a way of mitigating potential opposition to the Transmission Line Activity by increasing local stakeholders' benefit from the project. The MCA Partnership program sub-Activity is therefore not a project in itself, but an important supplementary and complementary effort within the ETP designed to help build relationships within potentially affected areas, gain trust, and mitigate the risk of delays to the project. MCA Partnership program shall be considered for any affected wards traversed by the right of way of the transmission line and substations. Possible MCA Partnership program may include but are not be limited to, providing electricity to un-electrified households through the use of local renewable resources such as solar photovoltaics or micro hydro or a combination of the two, extending the NEA grid to households within a ward that is already partly connected to the grid, promoting the local benefits of electricity use by electrifying schools, health centers, and market areas, etc. or similarly beneficial projects. These sub-activities are currently being developed through a consultative process.

Your understanding is correct. Neither MCA-Nepal partnership program nor its supervision is in the scope of the Consultant.

Works at New Damauli and New Butwal substation will include construction of 400 kV GIS substation.
