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		This line indicates that the RFO requires the consultant to submit relevant experience in livelihood planning and development specifically in the powe sector, in alignment with the three (3) sub-criteria outlined in sections 1.1, 1.2, and 1.3 of ITO 24.1. We seek clarification on whether work experience related to livelihood planning and development in infrastructure projects beyond the power sector—such as roads, irrigation, water resources, and agriculture—will also be considered during the evaluation process. Given that the criteria explicitly refer to the power sector, we respectfully request confirmation or whether non-power sector infrastructure projects with relevant livelihood development experience may also qualify under this criterion.

22.		Could you please confirm whether the required working experience should span? National-level, Provincial-level, Local-level programs or a combination of all three levels?	Question is not clear about experience of what, is it firm or individual? However, it depends upon the criteria stated in the RFP, if the regional experience is not mentioned in the criteria, experience of any level is acceptable.
